The City of Barnesville will be submitting an application to the MN Department of Employment and Economic Development (DEED) to rehabilitate both homes and businesses. If the application is funded, income qualified homeowners will be eligible for a deferred, **forgivable** 0% interest loan of up to \$24,850. Businesses may be eligible for a deferred, **forgivable** 0% interest loan up to \$40,000 (businesses will have a required match of 20%).

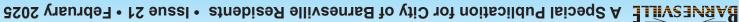

#### **2025 TAXES SHOW SMALL INCREASE**

On December 9, 2024 the Barnesville City Council adopted a tax levy of 7.11%. This is a slight decrease from the 2024 levy of 7.46%. The levy increase for 2025 comes out to be a \$28,000 increase from 2024 for

to be a \$28,000 increase from 2024 for operations of the city and \$55,000 for debt (due to the 2023a bond for the Front Street North capital project with MnDOT).

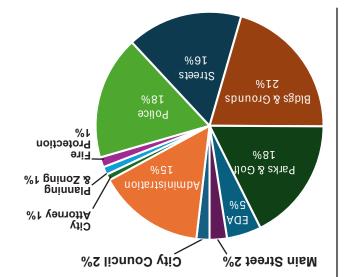

Barnesville home with an assessed value of \$250,000 would see an estimated tax increase of \$85.00 from 2024 to 2025. Of this, \$53.00 is the actual tax increase and \$32.00 for increased tax capacity.

#### THE CITY'S BUDGET PROCESS

Putting the annual City Budget together begins in July when the department heads submit their proposed department budget to the City Administrator. The City Administrator and Finance Director go over these submissions with each department head and refine the numbers prior to the Finance Committee taking a look at it. 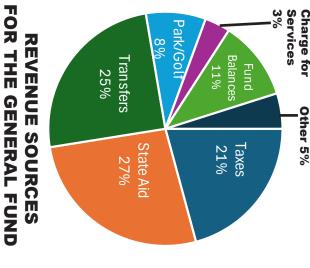
