BARNESVILLE Event Center

In 2022 the Barnesville American Legion Post 153 donated their building to the City of Barnesville for use as community space. On Giving Hearts Day, in February 2023, donors generously contributed \$72,692 to help fund the building's renovation into the Barnesville Event Center.



Frequently Asked Questions about the repurposing of the former American Legion building:

1. Why is it taking so long for the building to get done? When the city acquired the building we were unaware of the amount of renovation that would be needed. The structure was originally 3 buildings, so there were many building code issues and Clay Co. Health Department concerns which had to be addressed and fixed!

2. What work has been done in the building?

- · The external structure was reframed and reinsulated
- · Bathrooms totally replaced to be handicap accessible
- · Cabinets, counters and walls were replaced in kitchen
- · A grease trap was installed from kitchen to street
- New flooring and ceilings were installed throughout
- · All electrical wiring and outlets were replaced
- · New LED energy efficient lighting

3. Were enhancements made to interior space?

- · NEW lightweight, comfortable padded chairs
- · All new lightweight, easy to move tables
- NEW audio-visual system including 6 TV monitors
- NEW updated bar area

4. Will changes be made to the building's exterior? Interior improvements to the building is Phase 1. Once the building is up and operational, work will begin on Phase 2 - which will include the exterior of the building, parking lot improvements and landscaping on the east side of the building. This work will be completed in 2024.

5. When will the building be done?

It is anticipated that that interior of the building will be completed in late April or early May. Plans are to host an Open House in May. Information will be posted in the Review -Review, on Facebook and in the April City newsletter.

6. When can I start reserving the space?

Reservations will be accepted starting on Monday, April 15. The cost is dependent on the days being reserved, how many hours the space will be used and if the event will include food and/or alcohol. For details contact City Hall at 218.354.2292.

CLEAN UP WEEK APRIL 17, 18 and 19, 2024

• SPECIAL GARBAGE AND BUILDING DEBRIS PICK UP on Wednesday, April 17, Thursday, April 18 and Friday, April 19. All material must be set out by 5:00 a.m.

NEW! Loose garbage will NOT be picked up. All items need to be bagged and tied. ALL ITEMS MUST BE SEPARATED BY CATEGORY.

Piles will NOT be picked up if not separated by category.

If items will fit in a bag, they must be bagged. Each home is limited to 10 Cubic Yards of material - this is roughly a pile that is 6 feet wide, 15 feet long and 3 feet high.

Category #1 - Regular household garbage, cardboard, plastic items, carpet (cut in 4 ft lengths)

Category #2 - Building materials and sheetrock - small amounts only!

Category #3 - Old Furniture and Mattresses

Category #4 - Scrap metals and Bikes

NOT ACCEPTED - Used oils, paints, tires and batteries

- **WEDNESDAY, APRIL 17** all residential customers who live west of Highway 9 (Front Street) will also receive the special spring clean up, pick up of garbage, and small amounts of building debris.
- **THURSDAY, APRIL 18** all residential customers East of Front Street and North of and including 3rd Ave. SE will receive the special spring clean up, pick up of garbage, and small amounts of building debris.
- FRIDAY, APRIL 19 residential customers East of Front Street and South of 3rd Ave. SE (excluding 3rd Ave.SE) will receive the special spring clean up, pick up of garbage, and small amounts of building debris. If time allows, the crew will work ahead of the above schedule, but will do the entire route on the stated day and time.
- DURING THIS WEEK, garbage and building debris will be collected at your NEW normal garbage collection pick up location - no alleys. NO ADDITIONAL TAGS ARE NEEDED FOR THIS SPECIAL CLEAN UP WEEK.
- THERE WILL NOT BE CURBSIDE PICK UP OF TIRES. You may dispose of car and pickup tires at the recycling center upon payment of a \$9.00 fee per tire. *The rims must be removed before bringing them in. The recycling center will take tires all year during open hours at the same fee. Please note you must pay this fee at the recycling center.
- **IMPORTANT APPLIANCE INFORMATION:** Appliances can always be disposed of at the recycling center upon payment of a \$20 fee for non-freon appliances and \$35 for freon appliances. During the special three days of Spring Clean Up, appliances will be collected at your residence after payment of the required fee at the recycling center. Your name will be put on a list and appliances will be picked up periodically during the next week. Regular hours at the recycling center are Tues and Thurs 12-8 and Saturday 8:00 to noon.
